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### **Conteúdos programáticos**

Representações da identidade britânica; Convenções sociais e de cortesia na comunicação do quotidiano (cumprimentos, aceitação/rejeição de convites; Funções Comunicativas: expressar compreensão, descrever experiências e acontecimentos, expressar opiniões, usar com correção linguagem de concordância e discordância; Conteúdos Gramaticais. Revisão de advérbios, comparativos e superlativos, conectores (causa, efeito, contraste, etc.), verbos modais, tempos verbais (past continuous; past perfect, past simple, past tense responses, present perfect continuous, present perfec/past simple); wh- questions in the past; will and going to.

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### **Metodologias de ensino (avaliação incluída)**

A avaliação é contínua e contempla os quatro modos de comunicação explicitados no volume complementar do Quadro Europeu Comum de Referência para as Línguas (recepção, interação, produção e mediação) e o domínio dos conteúdos referidos na presente FUC.

É requerida aos alunos assiduidade igual ou superior a 75% das horas de contacto. Os alunos com assiduidade inferior a 75% das horas de contacto são excluídos da época normal de avaliação e são admitidos na época de recurso.

Os alunos que obtenham classificação inferior a 9,5 estão admitidos a exame de época normal. O exame consiste em provas escrita e oral em que se avaliam todos os modos de comunicação acima referidos, assim como os conteúdos da unidade curricular.

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#### Teaching methodologies (including evaluation)

Ongoing evaluation will take an action-oriented approach (outlined in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: Learning, teaching, assessment Companion Volume), whereby the 4 modes of communication will be evaluated: reception, production, interaction and mediation, as well as mastery of the contents laid out in this curricular unit (FUC).

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Attendance is mandatory for no less than 75% of total contact hours. Students who do not attend 75% of the total contact hours will only be allowed to take the ?Época de Recurso?. Students scoring a final average of 9.5 or higher pass the curricular unit. The rest will be admitted to exam. The exam will consist of written and oral assessments of all modes of communication stated above, as well as the contents of the curricular units.
