Metodologias de ensino (avaliação incluída)

A avaliação consiste em dois elementos de avaliação com pesos de 40% e 60%, respetivamente, que avaliem os quatro modos de comunicação explicitados no volume complementas do Quadro Europeu Comum de Referência para as Línguas (recepção, interação, produção e mediação) e o domínio dos conteúdos referidos na presente FUC.

É aconselhada uma assiduidade regular e nunca inferior a 75% das horas de contacto. Os alunos que obtenham uma classificação inferior a 9,5 nos referidos elementos de avaliação estão admitidos a exame de época normal. O exame consiste em provas escrita e oral em que se avaliam todos os modos de comunicação acima referidos, assim como os conteúdos da unidade curricular.

Teaching methodologies (including evaluation)

Ongoing evaluation will take an action-oriented approach (outlined in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: Learning, teaching, assessment & Companion Volume), whereby the 4 modes of communication will be evaluated: reception, production, interaction and mediation, as well as mastery of the contents laid out in this curricular unit (FUC). There will be two evaluation moments, worth 40% and 60% respectively. Students are advised to attend classes regularly and never less than 75% of total contact hours. Students scoring a final average of 9.5 or higher pass the curricular unit. The rest will be admitted to exam. The exam will consist of written and oral assessments of all modes of communication stated above, as well as the curricular unit contents.
