### Objetivos de aprendizagem (conhecimentos, aptidões e competências)

No final desta unidade curricular, espera-se que os alunos sejam capazes de:

- Identificar diferentes conceitos de cultura
- Compreender e relacionar informação sobre a identidade dos povos das Ilhas Britânicas e dos EUA
- Distinguir aspectos socio- políticos do Reino Unido e dos EUA
- Identificar marcos relevantes da cultura inglesa e americana contemporânea (literatura, pintura, musica, ect.)

### Conteúdos programáticos

- Diferentes perspectivas de análise do conceito de cultura: como aperfeiçoamento individual, como modo de vida de um povo, como representações coletivas .
- Traços identitários dos povos da Grã-Bretanha e dos EUA
- Contrastes da organização social e política do Reino Unido e dos EUA
- Marcos relevantes da cultura inglesa e americana contemporânea (literatura, pintura, musica, etc.)

### **Metodologias de ensino (avaliação incluída)**

Nas aulas T e TP serão explorados colaborativamente conceitos, ideias e factos relativos às culturas-alvo, em atividades que privilegiarão a oralidade, a leitura e a escrita. Nas sessões de OT será disponibilizado apoio ao trabalho a realizar pelos alunos.

Avaliação:

#### **UC com exame final**

Avaliação por frequência com *pelo menos um* elemento de avaliação presencial (50%) e o exame de época normal (50%).

Critério de assiduidade: exigência de assistência a, pelo menos, 75% das horas de contacto para admissão à avaliação no exame normal.

Todos os alunos regularmente inscritos estão automaticamente admitidos à exame de época de recurso.

Em todos os elementos de avaliação (incluindo exames) será atribuída uma percentagem de 20% à correção linguística e discursiva e à estruturação textual.

#### Syllabus

Different perspectives of analysis of the concept of culture: as individual improvement, as a way of life of a people, such as 'collective presentations'.

Identity traits of the peoples of Britain and USA

Contrasts of social and political organization of the United Kingdom and the United States of America

Relevant landmarks of English and American culture (literature, painting, music, etc.)

#### Teaching methodologies (including evaluation)

In T and TP classes concepts, ideas and facts relating to crops, will be explored in on oral, reading and writing activities. In the sessions of OT it will be provided support for the work to be performed by the students.

Evaluation:

Evaluation by test with at least one in-class assessment (50%) and an exam during ***época normal*** (50%).

**Attendance criteria:** in order to be admitted to exam during ***época normal***, students are required to attend, at least, 75% of the contact hours.

All enrolled students are automatically admitted to exam during ***época de recurso***.

In all evaluation moments (including exams) 20% of the total grade will be attributed to linguistic, discursive and textual structuring correction.
